20. VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. All Vehicles must comply with CAMS 4H and Schedule A of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.
- 2. Particular attention will be to all brakes, steering and tyres.
 - a. General occupant safety;
 - b. Steering:
 - c. Brake system
 - d. Seat belt/safety harness
 - e. Seat/s
 - f. Wheels/tyres
 - g. Security of objects in the cabin.
- 3. The Chief Scrutineer shall rule on the acceptability of any vehicle to compete in the Event. This will apply to vehicles fitted with non-compliant roll cages
- 4. All vehicles must have a correctly mounted Approved fire extinguisher of at least 900g capacity, and effective mud flaps fitted to drive wheels.
- 5. A Driver whose vehicle has broken down may use a replacement vehicle, provided the consent of the Clerk of the Course has been obtained. The replacement vehicle must be scrutineered before being allowed to compete and be used for the remainder of the competition.
- 6. Firewalls into the cabin of the vehicle need to be suitably sealed
- 7. All turbocharged vehicles must have the intercooler in the original position

21. APPAREL:

- 1. A minimum of a lap sash must be worn correctly at all times of competition complying with Schedule I of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport.
- 2. All Drivers must wear approved footwear whilst competing. Refer Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport
- 3. Approved helmet with visor or goggles must be worn and in closed cars which have the windscreen removed. Refer Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport
- 4. For all vehicles minimum clothing is "Neck to ankle to wrist" covering. Refer Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport.
- **22. REFUELLING:** Vehicles may only be refueled in the designated area. It is the Competitor's responsibility to ensure an allocated Official is present and a functional fire extinguisher provided by the Event is in place whilst refueling any vehicle. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- 23. METHOD OF TIMING: Will be either electronic timing to the 1/10th second or a manual timing system. Timing shall commence when the leading point of the car crosses the designated start line and shall cease when the leading point of the car crosses the designated finish line. The designated finish line shall not be more than one metre behind the front of the finish garage. If timing should fail to record a Competitor's time, then the Competitor shall be offered a re-run.

24. FLAGS / LIGHTS TO BE USED

Green – Used to indicate to the timers when competing vehicle has commenced its run by a dropping of the flag, the green flag will be displayed to indicate to the Driver they may commence their run

Red – indicates a situation has occurred (a danger on the course or a timing failure) which requires the Driver to cease their run. Any Driver who has been shown the red flag must immediately slow to a safe speed and proceed carefully to the next flag point for instructions from the Officials

Chequered - signals completion of the run

25. PENALTIES: As per Khanacross Regulations of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. A penalty of EXCLUSION may also be imposed by the Stewards of the Meeting for Infringements as prescribed by the current NCR's.

4WD & AWD Handicap -

All Class FM (Modified 4WD & AWD Production vehicles) will have an additional 5% handicap of the fastest Class FM vehicle added to recorded times.

All Class F (4WD & AWD Production vehicles) will have an additional 2.5% handicap of the fastest Class F vehicle added to recorded times.

All "slowest time plus 5 seconds" penalties will be based on the time of the slowest non junior competitor

26. JUDGES of FACT: All Officials shall be deemed to be Judges of Fact. This includes determining whether a course or test has been correctly completed, a garage correctly entered, a field garage correctly traversed or the accuracy in timing a Competitor's run. Further duties may be defined at the COMPETITORS BRIEFING as necessary.

- **27.** . **RESULTS:** The winner will be the Competitor that accumulates the least amount of time penalties, including time penalties for cone or garage Infringements.
- 28. PROTESTS: Must be lodged in accordance Part XII of the current National Competition Rules.
- 29. AWARDS: Trophies maybe awarded to 1st Outright and Class Awards if more than 3 Drivers in each class.
- **30. CANCELLATION OF EVENT:** Event Organisers reserve the right to cancel, abandon or postpone the Event in accordance with NCR 59 of the current CAMS Manual.
- 31. ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES: Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty/penalties for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing
- **32.** This Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the CAMS MSPRA Policy.
- 33. CATERING: Food and drinks will be available.
- 34. SPECTATORS: Spectators are free to spectate within the defined areas
- **35. VENUE RULES:**

Southern Districts Car Club requests that dogs must be **CONTROLLED AND ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES** whilst on the property. **NO ALCOHOL** is to be consumed during the event. **No fires** are to be lit on any part of the property. - xiv. Commercially available light vehicle tyres, including those marked LT or C will be allowed provided these tyres are appropriately speed rated and the tread pattern is of a road pattern, not a winter tread or mud and snow pattern or of any other aggressive nature.
- xv. Turbo intercoolers must be in the original position
- xvi. Engine swaps must be from the same manufacturer and have the same number of cylinders Failure to comply with the above items may result in the entry being placed in Modified Classes, excluded from results or excluded from competition

 - iii. All major lighting equipment must in place (headlights and tail lights) but not necessarily in working order. Ancillary lighting such as fog lights may be removed
 - iv. Front door trims must be fitted
 - v. Front doors must have original protrusion bars fitted unless roll cage has side protrusion bars fitted
 - vi. Front doors must remain operational with the original hinges and latch. Rear doors, tailgates and hatches may be modified leaving only the outer skin permanently and securely affixed in place
- vii. Windows maybe removed but drivers must note that eye protection must be worn when driving. Also of particular note is: if the windscreen is removed the vehicle must have rollover protection
- viii. Driveline is free
- ix. Driver's seat may be replaced with a racing seat but must have a harness type seatbelt fitted
- x. Front passenger seat may be removed
- xi. Turbo intercoolers must be in the original position
- xii. Rear seat may be removed however integrity of rear fire wall must remain
- xiii. Wheels and tyres must fit inside the guard (silhouette)
- xiv. May use any Rally tyre or tyres marked "not for highway use" or "for competition use only". However agricultural, bar and lug type tyres are not permitted.
- xv. Engine swaps must be from the same manufacturer and have the same number of cylinders
